


## Getting to the Emmanuel Community Church at the bottom of Chapel Street Duffield, DE56 4EQ

### From the North (Belper)

Coming from Belper, the A6 goes through a 40mph zone, and where it drops back to 30, the road does a sharp right and left over the river.

Then there is another 40mph zone,



then into the 30mph zone and Duffield high street. At the far end of the high street Chapel Street forks off to the right. (Difficult to miss unless there is a bus at the bus stop. If you get as far as the second pedestrian crossing you have gone too far.) Turn right into Chapel Street. Emmanuel is right at the bottom.




and when it drops back to 30 again, you are entering Duffield. Round a long gentle left hand bend, then a sharp right and another gentle left. At this point you should see a pedestrian crossing, and the NatWest bank on your left. Chapel Street is on the left just past the bank. Watch for a phone box one side of Chapel Street and a bus stop the other. Turn left into Chapel Street. Emmanuel is right at the bottom.

### From the South

The A6 runs north west of Derby towards Matlock. From the junction with the A38, you head into Allestree, past a Shell station on your left. Then into the 50mph zone and as you enter Duffield it drops to 40mph. Straight across at the traffic lights (but see "Parking below") and





### From Derby

Parking is a big problem in Duffield. The spaces on the main high street are 40 minutes only, and you are unlikely to find anything in Chapel Street - but - there will be limited parking by the church in the Ecclesbourne Valley Railway Car Park which has been made available to us.

There are plenty of side streets around where you can park but you just have to drive around looking for a space. If you find one, there is bound to be a walk to the church. If you get lost, ask anyone for the chip shop—Chapel Street is right

opposite it.

An alternative is to park on the Eyes Meadow car park, but it is a rather convoluted trip to get there (see the map).

**The railway bridge by St. Alkmunds will be closed on the day of the funeral.**


The post code for the church is DE56 4BA. If your satnav will do it, mark the bridge closed and get to the church.

From Belper it is easy. Where the A6 goes sharply right over the river—go straight on (See

map on previous page). It will eventually bring you out the correct side of the bridge. Turn left towards the church.

Just before you get to the actual church, the road swings right in a U turn and runs alongside the railway.

Drive all the way down to the bottom where you will find a car (probably muddy) park. Leave the car and walk back 20 yards and there is a tunnel under the railway. Through the tunnel and immediately on the right is a footpath that will bring you out right beside the church.




## Blackbrook House, Ashbourne Road, Belper DE56 2DB

*From the church, head back up to the main road and turn right towards Belper. Stay on the A6 for about 2.5 miles when you will come to the Morrison's roundabout.*

*Go straight over, staying on the A6, then go straight over the first set of traffic lights.*

*At the second set of traffic lights, turn left onto the A517 to Ashbourne and Blackbrook. From here (Belper) see below.*

### Blackbrook House.

Head to Belper. At the north end of Belper is a set of traffic lights. Take the A517 to Ashbourne and Blackbrook.

In just under a mile, you will come to the village of Blackbrook, and about 100 yards beyond the roadside sign, on the right, is Blackbrook Hall. The signs are very clear and it is quite difficult to miss.
